This usually requires documentation from a doctor corroborating the need for a particular type of assistive technology.



DISABILITY RIGHTS OREGON

If assistive technology is necessary for a child in special education, it should be identified as such and included in the child's Individualized Education Program (IEP).

EXAMPLES OF ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY:

MOBILITY, SEATING & POSITIONING

Wheelchairs and scooters
Standers, walkers and canes

VISION, HEARING & SPEAKING

Braille and Braille displays
Magnifiers
Text-to-voice and voice-to-text software
Video remote interpreting (VRI)
Augmentative communication devices

LEARNING & COGNITION

Note-taking/recording devices
Educational software

INDEPENDENT LIVING

Modified keyboards
Shower chairs
Therapeutic beds
